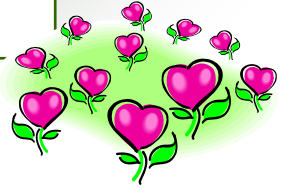

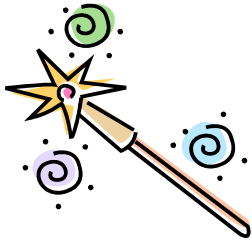

The fourth grade students spent the month of January reading from the genre of fairytales. During that time, the students followed a webquest reading their choice of two fairytales from a wide variety of titles. While reading, the students kept a reading log to analyze the characters, setting and plot of the fairytales. They used a comparison matrix to analyze the two fairytales according to their characteristics. The students worked with a partner to compare the fairytales, and they used character traits to write a riddle about one character. They are also working with a partner to write their own fairytale while incorporating three characteristics of fairytales in their writing. In addition, they are illustrating either a character, setting or the plot of the created fairytale using kid pix to provide a background for their illustration and importing objects from other sources. The fourth grade students did a wonderful job!
